

INTRODUCTION

This tool has many features for making its use more pleasant and enjoyable. Safety, performance, and dependability have been given top priority in the design of this product making it easy to maintain and operate.



WARNING:

Some dust created by power sanding, sawing, grinding, drilling, and other construction activities contains chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. Some examples of these chemicals are:

- lead from lead-based paints,
- crystalline silica from bricks and cement and other masonry products, and
- arsenic and chromium from chemically-treated lumber.

Your risk from these exposures varies, depending on how often you do this type of work. To reduce your exposure to these chemicals: work in a well ventilated area, and work with approved safety equipment, such as those dust masks that are specially designed to filter out microscopic particles.

GENERAL SAFETY RULES



WARNING!

Read all instructions. Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury. The term "power tool" in all of the warnings listed below refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS WORK AREA SAFETY

- Keep work area clean and well lit. Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.
- Do not operate power tools in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust. Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.
- Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool. Distractions can cause you to lose control.

ELECTRICAL SAFETY

- Power tool plugs must match the outlet. Never modify the plug in any way. Do not use any adapter plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools. Unmodified plugs and matching outlets will reduce risk of electric shock.
- Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators. There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed or grounded.
- Do not expose power tools to rain or wet conditions. Water entering a power tool will increase the risk of electric shock.
- When operating a power tool outdoors, use an extension cord suitable for outdoor use. Use of a cord suitable for outdoor use reduces the risk of electric shock.
- Use battery only with charger listed.

PERSONAL SAFETY

- Stay alert, watch what you are doing and use common sense when operating a power tool. Do not use a power tool while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication. A moment of inattention while operating power tools may result in serious personal injury.
- Use safety equipment. Always wear eye protection. Safety equipment such as dust mask, non-skid safety shoes, hard hat, or hearing protection used for appropriate conditions will reduce personal injuries.

- Avoid accidental starting. Ensure the switch is in the off-position before plugging in. Carrying power tools with your finger on the switch or plugging in power tools that have the switch on invites accidents.
- Remove any adjusting key or wrench before turning the power tool on. A wrench or a key left attached to a rotating part of the power tool may result in personal injury.
- Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times. This enables better control of the power tool in unexpected situations.
- Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing or jewelry. Keep your hair, clothing and gloves away from moving parts. Loose clothes, jewelry or long hair can be caught in moving parts.
- If devices are provided for the connection of dust extraction and collection facilities, ensure these are connected and properly used. Use of these devices can reduce dust-related hazards.
- Do not wear loose clothing or jewelry. Contain long hair. Loose clothes, jewelry, or long hair can be drawn into air vents.
- Do not use on a ladder or unstable support. Stable footing on a solid surface enables better control of the power tool in unexpected situations.

POWER TOOL USE AND CARE

- Do not force the power tool. Use the correct power tool for your application. The correct power tool will do the job better and safer at the rate for which it was designed.
- Do not use the power tool if the switch does not turn it on and off. Any power tool that cannot be controlled with the switch is dangerous and must be repaired.
- Disconnect the plug from the power source and/or the battery pack from the power tool before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing power tools. Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the power tool accidentally.
- Store idle power tools out of the reach of children and do not allow persons unfamiliar with the power tool or these instructions to operate the power tool. Power tools are dangerous in the hands of untrained users.
- Maintain power tools. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts and any other condition that may affect the power tool's operation. If damaged, have the power tool repaired before use. Many accidents are caused by poorly maintained power tools.
- Keep cutting tools sharp and clean. Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges are less likely to bind and are easier to control.

GENERAL SAFETY RULES

■ Use the power tool, accessories and tool bits etc., in accordance with these instructions and in the manner intended for the particular type of power tool, taking into account the working conditions and the work to be performed. Use of the power tool for operations different from those intended could result in a hazardous situation.

BATTERY TOOL USE AND CARE

- Ensure the switch is in the off position before inserting battery pack. Inserting the battery pack into power tools that have the switch on invites accidents.
- Recharge only with the charger specified by the manufacturer. A charger that is suitable for one type of battery pack may create a risk of fire when used with another battery pack.
- Use power tools only with specifically designated battery packs. Use of any other battery packs may create a risk of injury and fire.
- When battery pack is not in use, keep it away from other metal objects like paper clips, coins, keys, nails, screws, or other small metal objects that can make a

- **connection from one terminal to another.** Shorting the battery terminals together may cause burns or a fire.
- Under abusive conditions, liquid may be ejected from the battery, avoid contact. If contact accidentally occurs, flush with water. If liquid contacts eyes, additionally seek medical help. Liquid ejected from the battery may cause irritation or burns.

SERVICE

■ Have your power tool serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts. This will ensure that the safety of the power tool is maintained.



WARNING!

To reduce the risk of injury, user must read instruction manual.

■ When servicing a power tool, use only identical replacement parts. Follow instructions in the Maintenance section of this manual. Use of unauthorized parts or failure to follow Maintenance instructions may create a risk of shock or injury.

SPECIFIC SAFETY RULES

- Hold power tools by insulated gripping surfaces when performing an operation where the cutting tool may contact hidden wiring or its own cord. Contact with a "live" wire will make exposed metal parts of the tool "live" and shock the operator.
- Use clamps or another practical way to secure and support the workpiece to a stable platform. Holding the work by hand or against your body leaves it unstable and may lead to loss of control.
- Know your power tool. Read operator's manual carefully. Learn its applications and limitations, as well as the specific potential hazards related to this tool. Following this rule will reduce the risk of electric shock, fire, or serious injury.
- Always wear safety glasses with side shields. Everyday glasses have only impact resistant lenses. They are NOT safety glasses. Following this rule will reduce the risk of eye injury.
- Protect your lungs. Wear a face or dust mask if the operation is dusty. Following this rule will reduce the risk of serious personal injury.
- Protect your hearing. Wear hearing protection during extended periods of operation. Following this rule will reduce the risk of serious personal injury.
- Battery tools do not have to be plugged into an electrical outlet; therefore, they are always in operating condition. Be aware of possible hazards when not using your battery tool or when changing accessories. Following this rule will reduce the risk of electric shock, fire, or serious personal injury.

- Do not place battery tools or their batteries near fire or heat. This will reduce the risk of explosion and possibly injury.
- Do not crush, drop or damage battery pack. Do not use a battery pack or charger that has been dropped or received a sharp blow. A damaged battery is subject to explosion. Properly dispose of a dropped or damaged battery immediately.
- Batteries vent hydrogen gas and can explode in the presence of a source of ignition, such as a pilot light. To reduce the risk of serious personal injury, never use any cordless product in the presence of open flame. An exploded battery can propel debris and chemicals. If exposed, flush with water immediately.
- Do not charge battery tool in a damp or wet location. Following this rule will reduce the risk of electric shock.
- For best results, your battery tool should be charged in a location where the temperature is more than 50°F but less than 100°F. To reduce the risk of serious personal injury, do not store outside or in vehicles.
- Under extreme usage or temperature conditions, battery leakage may occur. If liquid comes in contact with your skin, wash immediately with soap and water, then neutralize with lemon juice or vinegar. If liquid gets into your eyes, flush them with clean water for at least 10 minutes, then seek immediate medical attention. Following this rule will reduce the risk of serious personal injury.
- If the power supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced only by the manufacturer or by an authorized service center to avoid risk.

WARNING!

READ AND UNDERSTAND ALL INSTRUCTIONS.

Failure to follow all instructions listed below, may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious personal injury.

■ **Before using battery charger,** read all instructions and cautionary markings in this manual, on battery charger, battery, and product using battery to prevent misuse of the products and possible injury or damage.



A CAUTION:

To reduce the risk of electric shock or damage to the charger and battery, charge only lithiumion or nickel-cadmium rechargeable batteries as specifically designated on your charger. Other types of batteries may burst, causing personal injury or damage.

- Do not use charger outdoors or expose to wet or damp conditions. Water entering charger will increase the risk of electric shock.
- Use of an attachment not recommended or sold by the battery charger manufacturer may result in a risk of fire, electric shock, or injury to persons. Following this rule will reduce the risk of electric shock, fire, or serious personal injury.
- Do not abuse cord or charger. Never use the cord to carry the charger. Do not pull the charger cord rather than the plug when disconnecting from receptacle. Damage to the cord or charger could occur and create an electric shock hazard. Replace damaged cords immediately.
- Make sure cord is located so that it will not be stepped on, tripped over, come in contact with sharp edges or moving parts or otherwise subjected to damage or stress. This will reduce the risk of accidental falls, which could cause injury, and damage to the cord, which could result in electric shock.
- Keep cord and charger from heat to prevent damage to housing or internal parts.

- Do not let gasoline, oils, petroleum-based products, etc. come in contact with plastic parts. They contain chemicals that can damage, weaken, or destroy plastic.
- An extension cord should not be used unless absolutely necessary. Use of improper extension cord could result in a risk of fire and electric shock. If extension cord must be used, make sure:
 - a. That pins on plug of extension cord are the same number, size and shape as those of plug on charger.
 - b. That extension cord is properly wired and in good electrical condition; and
 - c. That wire size is large enough for AC ampere rating of charger as specified below:

Cord Length (Feet) 25' 50' 100' Cord Size (AWG) 16 16 16

NOTE: AWG = American Wire Gauge

- Do not operate charger with a damaged cord or plug, which could cause shorting and electric shock. If damaged, have the charger replaced by an authorized serviceman.
- Do not operate charger if it has received a sharp blow, been dropped, or otherwise damaged in any way. Take it to an authorized serviceman for electrical check to determine if the charger is in good working order.
- Do not disassemble charger. Take it to an authorized serviceman when service or repair is required. Incorrect reassembly may result in a risk of electric shock or fire.
- Unplug charger from outlet before attempting any maintenance or cleaning to reduce the risk of electric shock.
- Disconnect charger from the power supply when not in use. This will reduce the risk of electric shock or damage to the charger if metal items should fall into the opening. It also will help prevent damage to the charger during a power surge.
- Risk of electric shock. Do not touch uninsulated portion of output connector or uninsulated battery terminal.
- Save these instructions. Refer to them frequently and use them to instruct others who may use this tool. If you loan someone this tool, loan them these instructions also to prevent misuse of the product and possible injury.



FEATURES

KNOW YOUR JIG SAW

See Figure 1.

The safe use of this product requires an understanding of the information on the tool and in this operator's manual as well as a knowledge of the project you are attempting. Before use of this product, familiarize yourself with all operating features and safety rules.

ANTI-SPLINTERING INSERT

The anti-splintering insert prevents splintering of the workpiece material for a smoother cut. It is especially helpful when cutting plywood.

BLADE GUARD

The wire blade guard helps protect the operator from accidental contact with the saw blade.

CHIP SHIELD

A clear plastic chip shield on the front of your saw helps protect against flying dust and chips.

NO-MAR PLATE

The no-mar plate has a smooth finish and can be snapped on over the metal shoe of the jig saw. This makes it easier to glide the tool along a delicate work surface without marring it.

ORBITAL ADJUSTMENT KNOB

The orbital adjustment knob allows you to select five orbital settings to cut materials of varying thickness and density.

RECESSED BLADE-SUPPORT ROLLER

The recessed blade-support roller ensures accurate cutting. Its hard-wearing die-cast aluminum casing helps protect against overheating.

TOOL-FREE BLADE CLAMP

The tool-free blade clamp does not require the use of a blade wrench when installing or removing the blade.

TOOL-FREE SHOE ADJUSTMENT

With the tool-free shoe adjustment lever, you can make quick changes to the bevel setting. The shoe can be angled 45° left or right for bevel cutting, with positive stops in 15° increments.

TRIGGER LOCK

The trigger lock prevents the saw from accidental starting. The switch trigger cannot be depressed until the trigger lock is depressed.

ASSEMBLY

UNPACKING

This product has been shipped completely assembled.

- Carefully remove the tool and any accessories from the box. Make sure that all items listed in the packing list are included.
- Inspect the tool carefully to make sure no breakage or damage occurred during shipping.
- Do not discard the packing material until you have carefully inspected and satisfactorily operated the tool.

If at any point during the charging process none of the LEDs are lit, remove the battery pack from the charger to avoid damaging the product. DO NOT insert another battery. Return the charger and battery to your nearest service center for service or replacement.

CAUTION:

Charge in a well ventilated area. Do not block charger vents. Keep them clear to allow proper ventilation.

NOTE: Charge only RIDGID lithium-ion batteries on the RIDGID lithium-ion charger and RIDGID nickel-cadmium batteries on RIDGID nickel-cadmium chargers. These batteries and chargers are not interchangeable.


THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS ARE FOR RIDGID 24V LITHIUM-ION BATTERY PACKS AND THE 24V RIDGID LITHIUM-ION CHARGER.

CHARGING THE BATTERY PACK

NOTE: New 24 Volt lithium-ion battery packs will not work without first being charged. Before first time use, charge the battery pack to activate it.

It is not necessary to drain the battery pack completely before recharging. Lithium-ion battery packs have no "memory" and can be recharged at any time. It is therefore possible to charge the battery pack before extended usage even if the battery pack is not completely drained of charge. Use the charge level indicator to determine the amount of charge in the battery pack.

Lithium-ion batteries deliver fade free power for their entire run time. 24 Volt lithium-ion tools will not gradually lose power due to decreasing battery charge. Instead, power from the battery pack will drop from full to zero once the full charge has been drained from the battery. Once this happens, the tool's power drops from full to zero, and recharging of the battery is required.



TO CHARGE

A fully discharged battery pack with a temperature between 32°F (0°C) and 150°F (65°C) will charge in about an hour.

- Charge the 24 Volt lithium-ion battery pack only with the charger provided.
- Connect the charger to a power supply.
 NOTE: If needed, the charger can operate with most generators and inverters rated at 300 Watts or higher.
- Attach the battery pack to the charger by aligning the raised ribs on the battery pack with the grooves in the charger, then slide the battery pack onto the charger. See Figure 2.
- Do not place the charger in an area of extreme heat or cold. It will work best at normal room temperature.
- After charging is complete, the continuous green light will come on and the charge level indicator lights on the battery will go off.
- The charger will keep the battery pack fully charged if left on the charger.

CHARGE LEVEL INDICATOR

See Figure 3.

The charge level indicator shows that the battery is charged at 1/4, 1/2, 3/4, or full capacity. To display the amount of charge left in the battery, press and hold the charge level indicator button.

NOTE: When the battery pack contains less than 10% charge, the 1/4 charge level indicator will flash.

CHARGING A HOT BATTERY PACK

If the battery pack is above normal temperature range, the red LED will begin flashing and the green LED will be off. When the battery pack cools down to approximately 150°F (65°C), the charger will automatically begin fast charge mode.


NOTE: Refer to **CHARGING THE BATTERY PACK** for normal recharging of batteries. If the charger does not charge the battery pack under normal circumstances, return both the battery pack and charger to your nearest repair center for electrical check. For the location of your nearest repair center, please call 1-866-539-1710.


CHARGING A COOL BATTERY PACK

If the battery pack is below normal temperature range, the red LED will begin flashing and the green LED will be off. When the battery warms to a temperature of more than 14°F (-10°C), the charger will automatically begin fast charge mode.

COLD WEATHER OPERATION

The lithium-ion battery pack can be used in temperatures down to -4°F (-20°C). When the battery pack is very cold, it may "buzz" for the first minute of use to warm itself up. Put the battery pack on a tool and use the tool in a light duty application. After about a minute, the pack will have warmed itself up and begin operating normally.

THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS ARE FOR RIDGID NICKEL-CADMIUM BATTERY PACKS AND CHARGERS.

Battery packs for this tool are shipped in a low charge condition to prevent possible problems. Therefore, you should charge the pack until the light on the front of the charger changes from flashing green to continuous green.

NOTE: Batteries will not reach full charge the first time they are charged. Allow several cycles (operation followed by recharging) for them to become fully charged. This is normal for nickel-cadmium batteries.

TO CHARGE

- Charge the battery pack only with the charger provided.
- Make sure the power supply is normal household voltage, 120V, 60 Hz, AC only.
- Connect the charger to a power supply.
- Attach the battery pack to the charger by aligning the raised ribs on the battery pack with the grooves in the charger, then slide the battery pack onto the charger. See Figure 5.
- The battery pack will become slightly warm to the touch while charging. This is normal and does not indicate a problem.
- Do not place the charger in an area of extreme heat or cold. It will work best at normal room temperature.
- For average charge times, refer to the chart on the following page.
- When the batteries become fully charged, unplug the charger from the power supply and remove the battery pack.


CHARGING A HOT BATTERY PACK


When using the tool continuously, the batteries in the battery pack will become hot. You should let a hot battery pack cool down for approximately 30 minutes before attempting to recharge. When the battery pack becomes discharged and is hot, the green LED will be off and the red LED will begin flashing.

When the battery pack cools down to approximately 104°F (40°C), the charger will automatically begin fast charge mode.

CHARGING A COOL BATTERY PACK

If the battery pack is below normal temperature range, the red LED will begin flashing and the green LED will be off. When the battery warms to a temperature of more than 41°F (5°C), the charger will automatically begin fast charge mode. **NOTE:** Refer to **CHARGING THE BATTERY PACK** for normal recharging of batteries. If the charger does not charge your battery pack under normal circumstances, return both the battery pack and charger to your nearest repair center for electrical check. For the location of your nearest repair center, please call 1-866-539-1710.

WARNING:

Battery tools are always in operating condition. Therefore, the switch should always be locked when not in use or carrying at your side.

STARTING/STOPPING THE SAW

See Figure 7.

To turn the saw **ON**, depress the trigger lock button and pull the switch trigger. Release the switch trigger to turn the saw **OFF**.

NOTE: The trigger lock button can be depressed from either side. The trigger lock automatically resets when the switch trigger is released.

TO INSTALL BATTERY PACK

See Figure 8.

- Slide the battery pack into the tool.
- Make sure the latches on each side of the battery pack snap into place and battery pack is secured in the saw before beginning operation.

TO REMOVE BATTERY PACK

See Figure 8.

- Depress the latches on each side of the battery pack to release the battery pack from the tool.
- The battery pack will automatically disconnect when the latches are depressed.




SPLINTER-FREE CUTTING

See Figure 9.

The anti-splintering insert is especially useful when cutting plywood. It should only be used when making straight cuts or circle cuts. It is not for bevel cutting or plunge cutting.

NOTE: The non-orbital setting also helps reduce splintering when cutting plywood.

To attach and remove the anti-splintering insert:

- Remove the battery pack.
- Set the cutting angle at 0°.
- To attach, slide the insert back onto the tabs on the front of the shoe. Make sure it snaps securely into place.
- To remove, grasp the anti-splintering insert and pull straight out.
- Reinstall the battery pack.

CHIP SHIELD

See Figure 10.

A clear plastic chip shield on the front of the saw helps protect against flying dust and chips.

To remove and reattach the chip shield:

- Remove the battery pack.
- To remove, grasp and push in the sides of the chip shield as shown. Pull out.
- To reattach, grasp and push in the sides of the chip shield as shown. Slide it into the slots on each side of the front of the saw.
- Reinstall the battery pack.


INSTALLING/REMOVING BLADES


See Figure 11.

NOTE: The jig saw is designed to use T-shank blades only.

To install blades:

- Remove the battery pack.
- Remove the chip shield and the anti-splintering insert if needed.
- Lift the blade clamp until it stops.
- Holding the blade clamp up, insert the saw blade as far as possible into the slot in the saw bar. Some resistance may be felt in doing this.
- Check to make sure the back of the saw blade is centered in the groove of the blade-support roller.
- Release the blade clamp. Make sure the blade is securely in place.
- Replace the chip shield and anti-splintering insert if needed.
- Reinstall the battery pack.







To remove blades:

- Remove the battery pack.
- Remove the chip shield and the anti-splintering insert if needed.
- Lift the blade clamp until it stops.
- Holding the blade clamp up, remove the saw blade.
- Reinstall the battery pack.

GENERAL CUTTING

See Figure 12.

Rest the front of the saw base on the workpiece and align cutting edge of the blade with the line on your workpiece. Start the saw and move it forward on the work surface. Apply downward pressure to keep the saw steady and only enough forward pressure to keep the blade cutting. Do not force the saw. Forcing the saw may overheat the motor and break saw blades. Broken saw blades must be replaced with new saw blades.

ORBITAL MOTION




The blade of the saw cuts in orbital motion. This may be adjusted for faster, more efficient cutting. With orbital motion, the blade cuts through your work in the upstroke but does not drag across your work in the downstroke. The higher settings should be used when fast cutting in soft material is desired. The lower settings should be used for slower cutting in materials with more resistance.

STRAIGHT CUTTING

See Figure 13.

A straight cut can be made by clamping a piece of wood or straightedge to the workpiece and guiding the edge of the saw against it. Make the cut from one direction only; don't cut halfway and complete the cut from the opposite end.





NOTE: Do not use the anti-splintering insert when making bevel cuts, scroll cuts, plunge cuts, and when cutting metal.

SCROLL CUTTING

See Figure 14.

Scroll cuts can be made with the jig saw by guiding the direction of the cut with applied pressure on the handle as shown.



WARNING:

Excessive side pressure to the blade could result in broken blades or damage to the material being cut.


ANGLE CUTTING (BEVEL CUTTING)


See Figures 15 - 16.

With the tool-free shoe adjustment, you can make quick changes to the bevel setting. The shoe can be angled 45° left or right for bevel cutting, with positive stops in 15° increments. A protractor is recommended when accurate cuts are required.

- Remove the battery pack from the tool.
- Push the shoe adjustment lever forward to loosen the shoe.
- Slide the shoe forward and to the left or right. Select the desired degree of bevel by aligning the tab on the motor housing with the appropriate notch on the rear of the shoe.
- Slide the shoe back (toward the rear of the tool) to fit the tab into the notch.
- Push the shoe adjustment lever firmly back into place. Make sure that the shoe is properly set before starting the jig saw.
- Reinstall the battery pack.

NOTE: When making a set-up for accurate cuts with a protractor, or for angles other than the preset 15° increments, the positive stop notches on the rear of the shoe are not used.





PLUNGE CUTTING

See Figures 17 - 18.



WARNING:

To avoid loss of control, broken blades, or damage to the material being cut, always use extreme caution when making plunge cuts. We do not recommend plunge cutting on materials other than wood.

- Mark the line of cut clearly on the workpiece.
- Set the cutting angle at 0° and the orbital adjustment knob to 0.
- Drill a pilot hole though any point on the line of cut.
- Using high speed, start the saw and slowly lower the blade through the pilot hole into the workpiece until the blade cuts through the wood.
- Do not move the base forward until the blade cuts entirely through the workpiece and the base is in complete contact with the workpiece.
- Move the saw forward to complete the opening.
- Use only the seven teeth per inch blade for this type of cut.




MAINTENANCE



WARNING:

WARNING:

Do not at any time let brake fluids, gasoline, petroleum-based products, penetrating oils, etc., come in contact with plastic parts. Chemicals can damage, weaken or destroy plastic which may result in serious personal injury.

Only the parts shown on the parts list are intended to be repaired or replaced by the customer. All other parts should be replaced at a RIDGID authorized service center.

BATTERIES

This tool will accept 24V lithium-ion batteries or 18V nickelcadmium batteries. Length of service from each charging will depend on the type of work you are doing.

The batteries for this tool have been designed to provide maximum trouble-free life. However, like all batteries, they will eventually wear out. Do not disassemble battery pack and attempt to replace the batteries. Handling of these batteries, especially when wearing rings and jewelry, could result in a serious burn.

To obtain the longest possible battery life, we suggest the following:

For lithium-ion batteries:

Remove the battery pack from the charger once it is fully charged and ready for use.

For battery pack storage longer than 30 days:

- Store the battery pack where the temperature is below 80°F and away from moisture.
- Store battery packs in a 30%-50% charged condition.
- Every six months of storage, charge the pack as normal.

For nickel-cadmium batteries:

 Remove the battery pack from the charger once it is fully charged and ready for use.

For battery pack storage longer than 30 days:

- Store the battery pack where the temperature is below 80°F.
- Store battery packs in a "discharged" condition.
